CAP Grant Deadline Very Soon

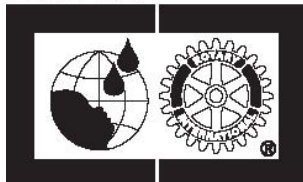
The clock is ticking and in just 10 days, the October 15th deadline for submission of CAP Grant applications will be upon us. Have you followed the following steps to ensure your club qualifies to submit an application? Step # 1 - View the CAP Grant Webinar (either the live event or the webinar link, which is posted as a Quick Link, under the title of CAP GRANT WEBINAR) and also available on the district website (www.rotary6060.org) on the page of Club Resources. Step # 2 is to submit the verification form (which verifies the Webinar has been viewed), located only on the district website; Step # 3 - Submit the CAP Grant application on or before October 15th. It is recommended to submit the application sooner to allow additional time to review the application for completeness.

Which Rotarians should view the webinar? Every club member including but not limited to club Presidents, Foundations Chairs, Grant Writers and interested club members who want to learn more and increase their perception of Rotary.

Rams' Rotary Football Day For Polio

Although the results on field are disappointing, I trust you will support this fellowship event to promote the "End Polio Now" campaign. Similar to our annual day at Busch Stadium, The St. Louis Rams have invited us to hold a "Rotary Day with the Rams" in conjunction with their game against the New Orleans Saints on Sunday, November 15, 2009. The event will supplement our fundraising for the Gate's Polio Plus Challenge. The Rams are matching funds that we raise in conjunction with ticket sales. In essence, we will raise about \$10.00 per ticket - the more we sell, the more "End Polio Now" benefits.

In addition, the Rams will give each club that sells 50 tickets or more, an autographed Rams replica jersey and scoreboard recognition. We have also acquired one of the "Sergeant's Select" Jack Daniel's Single Barrel bottle of Tennessee whiskey. Every Rotarian that purchases one of the first 100 tickets will have their name entered into a drawing for the bottle of "Sergeant's Select".
